

## Los Angeles County Civil Surgeon Provider Outreach Project Outcomes

Total number of civil surgeons included in project: 223

Total number of civil surgeons that were visited in person: 188

### Survey results

*1. Civil Surgeons are now required to report Latent TB Infection to the Local Health Department. Have you registered for a CalREDIE Provider Portal account?*

Of the 148 surveys, 89 (60.14%) had already registered for a CalREDIE provider portal account while 51 (34.46%) had not yet registered.

Of the 51 that had not yet registered, 37 (72.55%) did not know this was requirement and 10 (19.61%) did not have any LTBI cases to report, 3 (5.88%) did not know how to register, and 1 did not respond.

*2. Have you reported Latent TB Infection through the CalREDIE Provider Portal?*

Of the 148 surveys, 33 (22.3%) have reported LTBI through the CalREDIE provider portal, 113 (76.35%) have not reported LTBI through the CalREDIE provider portal, and 2 did not respond.

Of the 133 that have not reported LTBI, 53 (46.9%) did not have any LTBI cases to report, 33 (29.2%) did not know this was a requirement, and 9 (7.96%) did not know how to register for the CalREDIE provider portal, 2 (1.77%) did not have enough time, 9 (7.96%) responded "other", 7 did not respond.

*3. If you have a patient with Latent TB Infection, would you:*

Of the 148 surveys, 54 (38.03%) would provide treatment to a patient with LTBI, 126 (85.14%) would refer to another provider, and 2 (1.4%) said none of the above.

Of the 54 that would provide LTBI treatment, 10 (18.5%) provide 3HP, 9 (16.7%) provide 4R, 25 (46.3%) provide INH for 6 months, 28 (51.9%) provide INH for 9 months, 1 (1.85%) responded "other".

*4. What additional support would help you in reporting and treating Latent TB Infection?*

Of the 148 surveys, 76 (53.52%) responded "educational materials", 72 (50.7%) responded "webinar", 50 (35.21%) responded "in-person training", 36 (24.32%) responded "other", 13 (9.15%) responded "none", and 6 (4.23%) responded "Access to LTBI treatment regimens".

*5. For TB materials, which language(s) would be most helpful for your patients?*

Of the 148 surveys, 97 (68.31%) responded "English", 94 (66.2%) responded "Spanish", 22 (15.49%) responded "Chinese", 16 (11.27%) responded "Armenian", 14 (9.86%) responded "Tagalog", 11 (7.75%) responded "Korean", 9 (6.34%) responded "Russian", 5 (3.52%) responded Vietnamese, 3 (2.11%) responded "Thai", 1 (0.7%) responded "Cambodian, and 21 (14.19%) responded "Other" and listed a variety of middle-eastern languages (i.e. Farsi).
