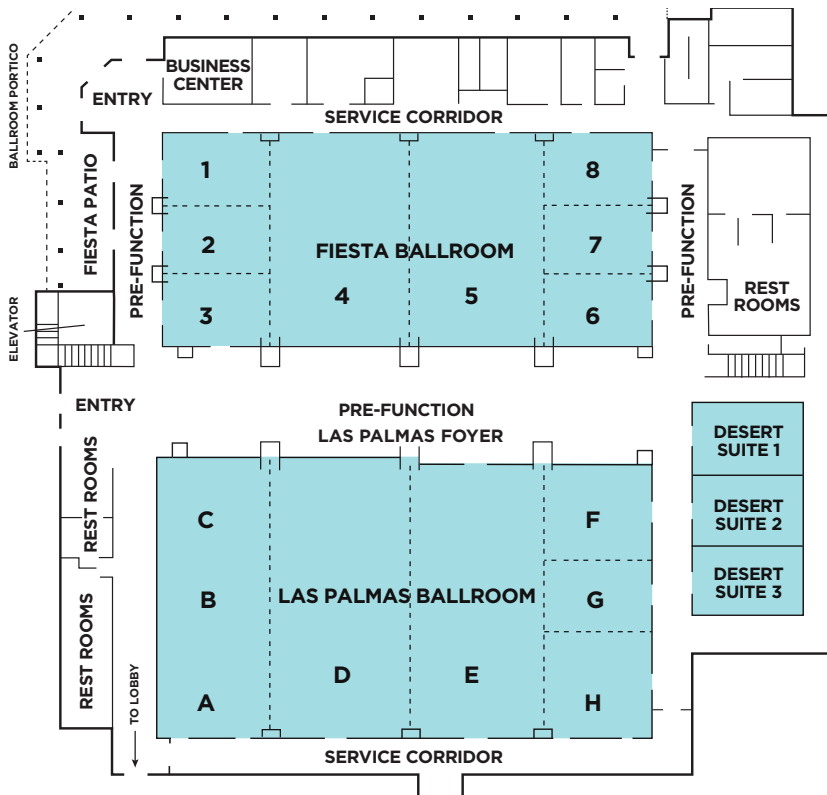

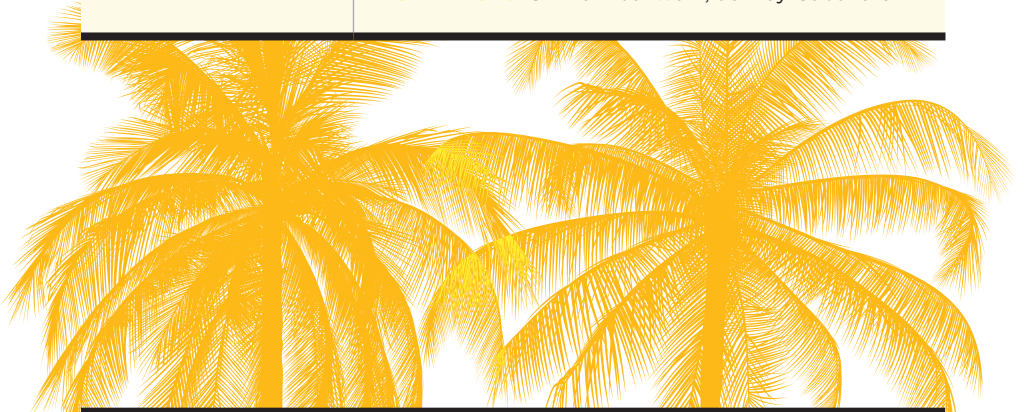

 - To receive CME credit for the Main Conference, you must complete evaluations for your attended sessions and the overall conference evaluation.
- **Attendees requesting CME or nursing credits will receive separate continuing education certificated for each of the 4 CEU-accredited sessions they attend (sign in) and evaluate.**
- **Certificates will be available on the Curry International Tuberculosis Center website approximately twelve weeks after the conclusion of the 30th National TB Conference to all attendees who requested CME or nursing credits on their applications and who successfully complete the educational conference session.**

 - All CME recipients will be contacted 4 months after the educational conference session to assist with long-term evaluation activities.

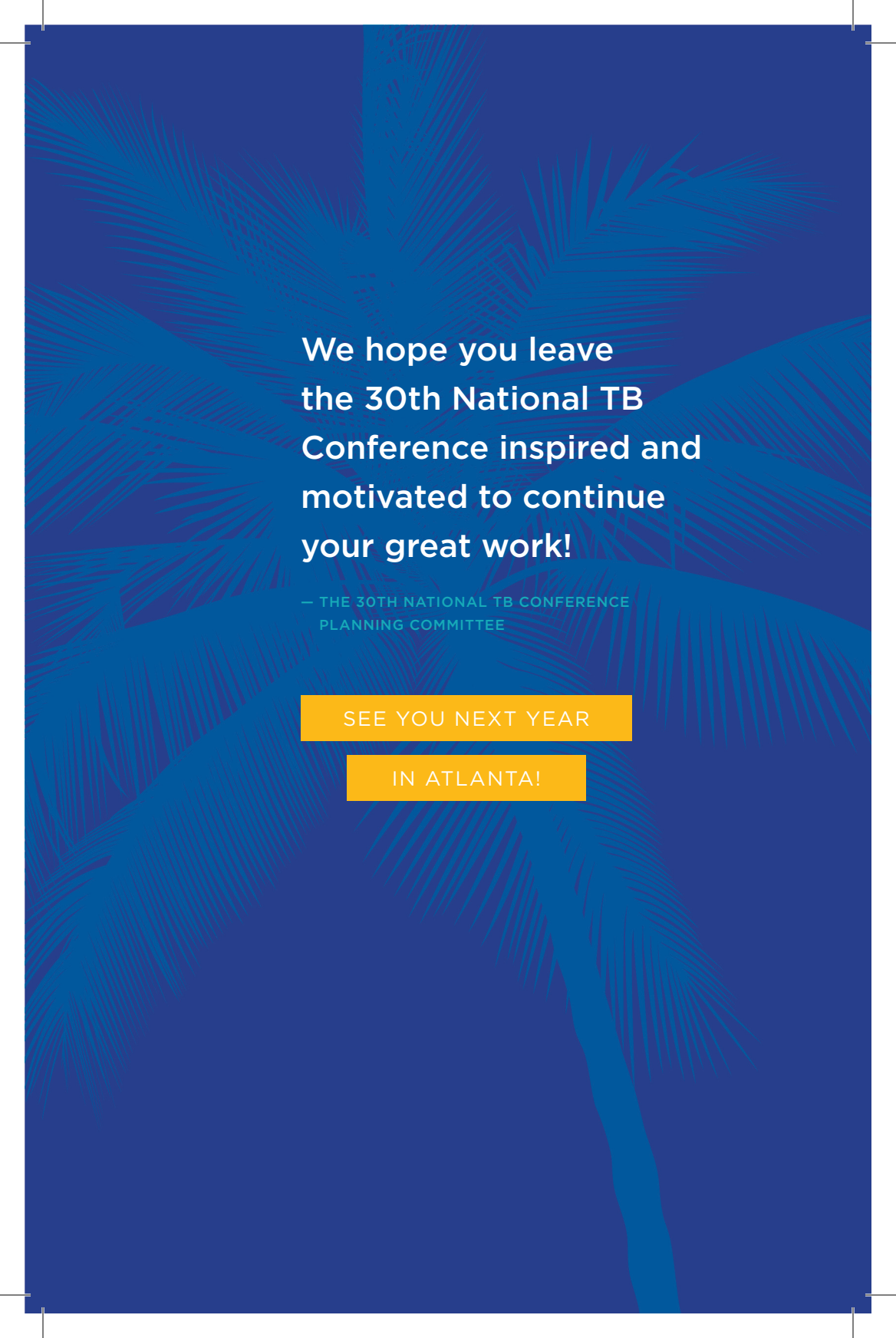
