Facilities or agencies applying for Title 22 program flexibility to deviate from annual testing requirements are required to do so on a periodic basis (maximum four years) by the Center for Health Care Quality (CHCQ) and should submit this form with attestation to the following procedures and practices in their application to CHCQ. (https://www.cdph.ca.gov/Programs/CHCQ/LCP/Pages/California-TB-Testing-Regulations.aspx).

Intermediate Care Facility for the Developmentally Disabled-Habilitative (ICF/DD-H) **Psychology Clinic** . Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNF)

The California TB Controllers Association does not support Title 22 program flexibility for annual TB testing in Correctional Treatment Centers (CTCs).

- Mandated reporting for TB and suspected TB (California Code of Regulations, Title 17, Section 2500, including initial report of a hospitalized patient.

- Required local health department approval for hospital discharge (Gotch Law HSC 121361 (<u>https://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/faces/codes_displaySection.xhtml?sectionNum=121361.&lawCode=HSC</u>)
- Contact investigation outcome following a TB exposure within the healthcare facility. (<u>https://www.dir.ca.gov/title8/5199.html</u>)



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acknowledges the following are best practices for infection prevention and employee health in healthcare personnel on an ongoing basis.

- Annual documentation of percent TB test conversion for annual testing, which is the number of HCP with positive TB test within two years of a previous negative TB test/total number of HCP undergoing annual testing in a given year.
- Annual documentation of percent of contact investigations with possible or confirmed TB transmission, which is the number of contact investigations with possible or confirmed TB transmission in a year/ total number of contact investigations in a year.
